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Session 1 Viewer Guide

Our God is a God of <u>abundance</u>.

Yahweh was offering the children of Israel <u>satisfaction</u> in their lives.

John 10:10, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

Of all the Jews who had the chance to experience the promised land, only <u>two</u> took God up on His offer.

Israel had been in captivity in Egypt approximately <u>400</u> <u>years</u>.

There must be deliverance to even begin the journey.

Just like Israel, we need to be delivered from:

a. A <u>person</u>

b. A <u>place</u>

Israel needed deliverance from Pharaoh; we need <u>deliverance</u> <u>from</u> <u>Satan</u>.



In the Old Testament, the deliverer was <u>Moses</u> . In the New Testament, the deliverer is <u>Jesus</u> <u>Christ</u> .
The only way to have a relationship with God is through His Son, <u>Jesus</u> <u>Christ</u> .
Each of us must <u>decide</u> if we want to go where God is leading.
In order to get milk and honey, the Israelites had to <u>walk</u> away from the place where Pharaoh ruled.

Galatians 5:1, "It was for freedom that Christ set us free; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery."

Two questions:

- 1. Have you been freed from the person of the Enemy in your life?
- 2. Have you been freed from the places where the Enemy reigns?

Exodus 13:17

"Now when Pharaoh had let the people go, God did not lead them by the way of the land of the Philistines, even though it was near; for God said, 'The people might change their minds when they see war, and return to Egypt.'"

God <u>chose</u> the wilderness for the people of Israel.

There are some things we don't know about ourselves until we are put in a position where we have to see God's power <u>working</u> <u>through</u> <u>us</u>.

God will <u>comfort</u> us by His Holy Spirit. <u>Trust</u> Him with the wilderness.


God wants to develop us, and He uses the wilderness to do it.



Exodus 13:17-18

Hence God led the people around by the way of the wilderness to the Red Sea; and the sons of Israel went up in martial array from the land of Egypt."

"Therefore"

The "therefore" is the connecting link between the hugeness of our sin and the far greater enormity of His love for us in spite of that sin.

The wilderness reveals to us:

1. The <u>passion</u> of God

Hosea 2:14

"Therefore, behold, I will allure her, Bring her into the wilderness And speak kindly to her."



Allure: to entice by charm; to attract

Romans 8:18

"For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us."

Intimacy with us is God's <u>goal</u>.

2. The *power* of God

3. The <u>purpose</u> of God

The same <u>Yahweh</u> who was willing to pay a price for His beloved people in the Old Testament is the same God who loved us so much He was <u>willing</u> <u>to pay a great</u>, <u>high</u> <u>price</u> in the New Testament.

He was willing to send His <u>only</u> begotten Son to die on the cross of Calvary.

Kadesh-Barnea was an oasis, the <u>oasis</u> <u>of</u> <u>complacency</u>

Joshua took God at His <u>word</u>.



God doesn't call people because they are equipped. Heequips them because He'scalled them.
The area of <u>sensitivity</u> and <u>tenderness</u> in your life is probably the area where God wants you to experience the most victory, where He wants the biggest ministry to come from your life.
God doesn't call us to do the possible. He calls us to do the impossible and then He equips us to handle it.
3. Joshua <u>acknowledged</u> the presence of God.
