SESSION 1

## VIEWERGUIDE

### THE ANOINTING: ESTABLISHED AND EMPOWERED

1. First Chronicles 14:2 tells us that David knew two things: He knew whose he was, and he knew who he was.
2. The word “established” is the same word used in Psalm 119:90 to talk about how the Lord established the earth or founded the earth.
3. When the Philistines heard that David had been anointed (1 Chron. 14:8).
4. The anointing is “a divine empowerment or a divine enablement to accomplish God’s purposes for your life.”



5. If you are a believer in Jesus Christ, the anointing of God rests on your life.

6. The anointing guarantees opposition.

7. David's first mission as king was to bring back the ark of God, which represented the presence of God.

8. Personally bringing back the ark of God means setting up the presence of God as the central focal point of every decision you make.

## GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. David wanted the ark to be in Jerusalem as a symbol of God's presence. What represents God's presence to you?
2. What opposition did David face? What opposition do women who are trying to serve God face today?





## SESSION 2

# VIEWERGUIDE

## THE ANOINTING: DIRECTED AND GUARANTEED

1. God is not looking for perfect women. He is looking for passionate women.
2. We have a Father whose heart for us is love.
3. Having a God awareness is going to cost you something and cause you to make decisions that you would not normally make.
4. The enemy has a three-part game plan to kill, steal, and destroy (John 10:10).
5. The anointing not only guarantees you opposition, but it also guarantees you access to God.



6. David's example shows us that the most important thing that we can have is a fresh, ongoing, intimate relationship with God.
7. The anointing not only guarantees you opposition and access to God but it also guarantees you specific, divine direction from God.
8. The more you know God, the more clearly you will be able to hear Him.
9. The anointed are not only guaranteed opposition, access to God, and specific, divine direction from God, but also we are guaranteed supernatural results when we obey God.

## GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. We as believers have access to God. How do we have access to God? What can we expect as a result of that access?
2. What are some of your favorite promises from God's Word?

## VIEWERGUIDE

### MOVING PAST OUR DEVASTATION

1. We can have a good idea that's not a God idea (Luke 2:4).
2. This far moments with God
3. There's a very big difference between relief and release.
4. God has come to absolutely mark our lives with His glory. ... He's come to take us this far. ... So far it has to be God.
5. God is not interested in just adjusting our lives. He wants us transformed.
6. I don't want a tweak; I want a transformation. ... A full-fledged so far transformation.

### SIN IS DEADLY

#### Scriptures That Tell Us What Sin Is

1. **James 4:17** Sin is to know the right thing and not do it.
2. **First John 3:4** Sin is lawlessness. It means that you are not going to keep the law of God.
3. **First John 5:17** All unrighteousness is sin. To not do what is right in the eyes of God is sin.
4. **Romans 14:23** Whatever is not of faith is sin.

#### Five Things About Sin

2 Samuel 11–12; 1 Chronicles 11:41

1. Sin will take you further than you ever intended to go.



2. When you sin, you are despising God (2 Sam. 12:9).

3. Sin is evil (2 Sam. 12:9).

4. The temptation to sin is not more than you can bear (1 Cor. 10:13).

5. Sin costs you more than you expected to pay (Num. 32:23).

2. What did God's grace mean to you at the time of your salvation? What does it mean to you today?

1. Sin will take you farther than you ever expected to go; it will keep you longer than you ever intended to stay, and it will cost you more than you ever expected to pay.

2. What is grace?

3. Grace is favor.

*Charis* (Greek): free, unearned, in contrast to something you would earn or something you would work for.

4. Grace is available because God is gracious.



5. Grace is power (2 Cor. 12:7-10).

6. Grace is previous (Eph. 1:3).

## GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. How has God protected you or stopped you from going too far on a dangerous path? What new insights did you glean about God's grace?

2. How has His power and favor been evident after a wrong turn?
